General Summary

The Electronic Assembler is responsible for the assembly and testing of electronic test devices used in the construction industry.

Job Responsibilities

- Soldering and crimping of cable harnesses for electronic testing equipment
- Assembly of sub-assemblies for electronic test devices
- Frequent use of hand tools
- Use of voltmeter, oscilloscope, and other test equipment
- Read, interpret, and follow basic blueprints, diagrams, engineering drawings, and other written instructions or procedures
- Maintain a clean, organized and safe work area

Experience

- Minimum 3-5 years of solder and crimping experience is preferred.
- A minimum of 2-3 years of assembly experience is preferred.
- Must also possess good mechanical and basic computer skills.
- High attention to detail and self-motivation skills.
- Basic computer navigation and utilization skills.

Physical Requirements

- Manual dexterity to operate office equipment. Requires extended periods of standing, walking, and sitting
- Normal or corrected vision and hearing to normal range
- Light Work - Exerting up to 20 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 10 pounds of force frequently, and/or a negligible amount of force constantly (Constantly: activity or condition exists 2/3 or more of the time) to move objects
